Requested Action by BOT

Approval of new General Counsel contract with Vose Law Firm, LLP.

Background and Summary Information

On October 8, 2021, General Counsel Repperger submitted his resignation letter to the BOT. Subsequently, the BOT authorized a recruitment process that resulted in seven applicants and interviews of the top three ranked firms. On December 1, 2021, the BOT authorized Chairman Maino and Community Manager Coffey, ICMA-CM to negotiate a contract with John Cary of Vose Law Firm, LLC.

The attached proposed contract is for five years, with a 60 day out clause for both parties. Cost is \$7,500.00 per month excluding risk management insurance defense and general bond counsel work.

Staff recommends the BOT approve the contract for General Counsel services with Vose Law Firm, LLC at an annual cost of \$90,000.

GENERAL COUNSEL AGREEMENT BAREFOOT BAY RECREATION DISTRICT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 17th day of December, 2021, by and between the BAREFOOT BAY RECREATION DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES, hereinafter "BBRD," and VOSE LAW FIRM LLP, hereinafter referred to as the "General Counsel."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the General Counsel is a law firm made up of attorneys who are duly licensed, authorized, and admitted to practice law in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, BBRD is an Independent Special District in need of legal services in order to provide quality governance; and

WHEREAS, BBRD desires to retain the General Counsel to provide legal services as General Counsel for BBRD; and

WHEREAS, the General Counsel has agreed to serve in such capacity for BBRD and perform the duties of its General Counsel.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the premises and the promises, covenants and agreements herein contained, and of other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the parties BBRD and the General Counsel agree as follows:

1. The General Counsel has been selected by and shall serve at the pleasure of the BBRD Board of Trustees. The General Counsel shall work *with* the BBRD Community Manager and Staff but shall work *for* and shall be accountable *to* the BBRD Board of Trustees.

2. The term of this Agreement shall be five (5) years, with further terms thereafter as determined by the then sitting Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees by majority vote shall have the authority to terminate this Agreement at any time, and the General Counsel agrees to continue to provide legal services for no less than 60 days after termination, if requested by the Board of Trustees. Should the General Counsel terminate the Agreement, it shall give no less than sixty (60) days advance written notice.

3. The General Counsel shall furnish to the BBRD all applicable professional and legal services, including, personnel, management, materials, and related items, and shall perform all operations necessary to satisfactorily carry out its duties as follows:

A. Attend all meetings of the BBRD Board of Trustees as designated and directed by the BBRD.

B. Defend the BBRD as directed by the BBRD in all legal matters and litigation and/or work with assigned claims counsel in liability matters.

C. Prosecute such legal causes as directed by the BBRD.

D. Draft such resolutions, agreements, laws, and other legal documents as required by the BBRD.

E. Render such legal opinions, advice, and legal counseling as requested by the BBRD.

F. File proceedings to validate obligations, certificates, or bonds to be issued by the BBRD and/or work with outside counsel for this purpose.

G. Prepare necessary legal documents and close all real estate transactions entered into by the BBRD.

H. Provide legal advice to BBRD Community Manager, and/or designees, related to BBRD operations.

I. Such other legal services as requested by the BBRD including review of and/or amendments to the BBRD Charter and/or Deed of Restrictions.

4. Should the General Counsel have an unavoidable conflict, (none of which are anticipated, and which the General Counsel agrees not to intentionally create), the General Counsel shall assist the BBRD in retaining appropriate legal counsel for the matter in which the conflict exists.

5. The attorneys providing services on behalf of the General Counsel shall be members in good standing of The Florida Bar.

6. The General Counsel shall be available as appropriate for legal workshops for the BBRD and its boards, committees, and agencies to discuss pending BBRD legal issues and to provide for adequate training for the members of such bodies and BBRD staff to ensure, to the maximum extent practicable, a high quality and high functioning independent special district government for the BBRD. The General Counsel shall not be involved in BBRD political campaigns.

7. The General Counsel shall be compensated at the monthly rate of \$7,500.00, which will be paid in arrears by the BBRD in accordance with its normative processes and procedures. No itemization of specific work performed shall be required or provided. This compensation shall cover all general and litigation legal services, and there shall be no additional charges for travel time, travel expenses, or legal research tools such as Westlaw or Lexis. With regard to other out of pocket expenses, (such as court reporter fees, or filing fees), the General Counsel may transmit invoices in the name of the BBRD for services to the BBRD for payment in accordance with its normative processes and procedures or may advance such expenses and separately bill the BBRD therefor. Partial months of service shall be compensated based upon a daily rate determined by dividing the monthly rate by the number of days in the month and multiplying such quotient by the number of calendar days included in the term of the contract.

8. The General Counsel shall take all actions that reflect highly upon the BBRD and shall act in a manner that advances the BBRD and its programs, projects and activities.

9. As an independent contractor providing legal services, the General Council agrees to maintain appropriate malpractice insurance covering at least \$1,000,000 per claim.

10. The rights, obligations, and remedies of the parties as specified under this Agreement shall be interpreted and governed in all respect by the laws of the State of Florida. Venue for any litigation involving this Agreement shall be the Circuit Court in and for Brevard County, Florida. The parties agree that any suit, action, or other legal proceeding arising hereunder shall be before a judge and each hereby intentionally, voluntarily, and knowingly waive any right the parties may have to a trial by jury. In any action or proceeding between the parties arising out of this Agreement or the transaction contemplated hereby, the prevailing party in such action or proceeding shall be entitled to recover all costs of such action or proceeding negotiations at trial and on appeal.

11. Pursuant to Florida Statutes, Section 119.0701, the General Counsel agrees to:

a) Keep and maintain public records required by the BBRD to perform the service.

b) Upon request from the BBRD's custodian of public records, provide the BBRD with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided under BBRD's procedures or as otherwise provided by law.

c) Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the General Counsel does not transfer the records to the BBRD.

d) Upon completion of the contract, transfer, at no cost, to the BBRD all public records in possession of the General Counsel or keep and maintain public records required by the BBRD to perform the service. If the General Counsel transfers all public records to the BBRD upon completion of the contract, the General Counsel shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the General Counsel keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the contract, the General Counsel shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the BBRD, upon request from the BBRD's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the BBRD.



Overview of Firm and Local Government Representation Experience

It is with pleasure that the Vose Law Firm LLP makes this proposal to provide Legal Services for the Barefoot Bay Recreation District ("Barefoot Bay"). 

L. The County Attorney shall be expected to make a reasonable effort to respond to requests from County Commission or County staff within the time period required by the County.

Accessibility and Responsiveness

"When our clients succeed, so do we!"

The most important services an attorney representing a local government can provide are: i) timely, accurate and thorough legal services that meet the needs of the government; ii) proactive resolution of pending claims to prevent future claims against the government; and iii) creatively formulate legal strategies to accomplish the goals of the Board of Trustees. There are a myriad of ways to accomplish these goals, and the attorneys of the Vose Law Firm are skilled in achieving excellent results for their clients, and in keeping their clients out of unnecessary litigation.

When you need us, we will be there.

John Cary, who would be the designated General Counsel to Barefoot Bay, lives in West Melbourne. Becky Vose, who would be John Cary's primary backup attorney, is the City Attorney of Cocoa Beach and has a condominium on the Indian River just south of Cocoa Beach. Therefore, our attorneys would essentially be readily available to be at Barefoot Bay whenever needed. Our office hours are typically between 8:00 am to 5:00 pm; however, the attorneys of our firm are available to our clients at all hours and days, including weekends, holidays and evenings. We know that when our clients need us, we have to be available – and we are. All the attorneys of our firm always keep their cell phones available and turned on (except when muted during meetings). We also monitor our emails regularly.

Recently, Nancy Stuparich (now the City Attorney of Naples) answered a quickly set up conference call relating to an emergency that had just occurred in one of our cities. Nancy answered the call even though she was on vacation out of state. After several minutes of discussing the situation, Becky Vose, who was also on the conference call, noticed a persistent whistling sound on the phone. Becky asked what the sound was and Nancy, who is a tri-athlete, responded that she had answered the call at about mile 11 of a marathon that she was running. She had been fully participating in the conference call, making excellent recommendations to our client, while running a marathon. That is an example of the energy and enthusiasm our firm brings to our clients.

With the availability of remote technology, our attorneys are essentially immediately available when our clients need us. If it is imperative that in person presence by an attorney is needed, and a Zoom meeting would not be acceptable to the district, we could typically accommodate that request within one or two hours, depending upon the then current location of our attorneys.



Our firm uses a collaborative approach to legal services.

One way that the attorneys of the Vose Law Firm ensure timely, accurate, and thorough legal services for their clients is the use of a collaborative approach to the rendering of services. The attorneys and paralegals of the firm have regular weekly meetings (usually using remote technology) to discuss pending issues and cases. As new issues arise, informal meetings are held daily to discuss them, again, usually remotely. In this way, at any one time, more than one attorney in the firm is fully cognizant of outstanding issues. In the unlikely event that the attorney who is primarily responsible to a client is unavailable to deal with an emergency, there will always be a back-up attorney to provide the needed services. Opinions rendered by the attorneys of the firm are typically reviewed by another attorney in the firm before such opinion is issued.

If chosen to represent Barefoot Bay, it is proposed that the Vose Law Firm will be the independent special districts' counsel, with joint primary responsibility in John Cary, (who would hold the title "General Counsel"), Becky Vose, and Stephanie Velo for managing the relationship with Barefoot Bay, and attending Board of Trustee meetings and other district meetings as needed. This collaborative approach to our representation of local government clients has historically worked extremely well to ensure uninterrupted, thorough, and expert representation of our local government clients. The assigned attorneys do not have any current time conflicts with regularly scheduled Barefoot Bay meetings.

Our attorneys pride themselves in being able to typically respond with substantive advice to elected and appointed officials of our local governments in a matter of minutes when contacted. If legal research is needed to respond to an inquiry, we always acknowledge the request, then promptly do the legal research needed to accurately and fully respond to the question.

The collaborative approach to City Attorney services proposed for Barefoot Bay is the same manner and approach utilized by our firm in its representation of its other local government clients including, but not limited to, the Cities of Cocoa Beach, Naples, Anna Maria, Daytona Beach Shores, South Daytona, Brooksville, Bunnell, the Town of Oakland, and the Village of Indiantown, as well as Okeechobee County, Orange County, and Monroe County. At any time, the full resources of the Vose Law Firm will be available to Barefoot Bay. That includes the active involvement and representation by seven (7) highly

Our firm's business model of representing local government clients based upon an all-inclusive flat rate including litigation perfectly aligns our firm's interests with the interests of our clients. If, however, one of our clients wants to accomplish something that requires us to file suit on behalf our client, we "go for the jugular" and resolve litigation we file with a minimum of fuss and without unnecessary posturing and wasted legal theatrics. Typically, we resolve lawsuits quickly and decisively, saving the staff of our local governments a great deal of work, and accomplishing the goals of our clients expeditiously and virtually always in a manner that has excellent results for our clients.



An example of proactive and client-centered legal work provided by the Vose Law Firm was for the City of Anna Maria when the firm took over as City Attorney in 2015. Anna Maria had been told by its previous city attorney that there was nothing that could be done about the burgeoning problems with vacation rentals that were plaguing the city. Approximately half of the beloved "bungalows" in Anna Maria that had been the historic residence of choice in the over hundred-year history of that city had already been torn down, and been replaced with what the native Anna Maria citizens pejoratively referred to as "McMansions". Most "McMansions" held vacation rentals that housed up to 22 people each on a small (50' x 100') bungalow lot. The problems with vacation rentals were tearing the city apart. At the direction of the Anna Maria City Commission the attorneys of the Vose Law Firm drafted a comprehensive vacation rental ordinance that imposed reasonable, but strict, restrictions on vacation rentals. The Vose Law Firm successfully defended the ordinance in three different court challenges, and settled with \$0 paid to any claimants, over 100 Bert Harris claims.

Another litigation technique that greatly benefitted a former local government client of the Vose Law Firm was demonstrated in the *Manji v. City of Deltona* case. When the Vose Law Firm became the city attorney of Deltona, (a city with a population of over 87,000), the firm inherited numerous lawsuits. One of those cases was the *Manji* case, which was an inverse condemnation action in which there was a claim of damages against the city in excess of \$2 Million. The case had been pending for seven years, and five different attorneys had worked on it for the city, but there had been little substantive progress on the case during that time.

After thoroughly reviewing the case, and talking with the City Manager, the Vose Law Firm recommended noticing the case for trial, and at the same time making an offer of judgment of \$50,000. This was approved by the City Commission. The offer of judgment was declined by the plaintiffs and Becky Vose tried the case in a two-day trial. The city won the case, and the court found that the city had no liability whatsoever. The Vose Law Firm then filed a motion to assess fees and costs against the plaintiffs based on the offer of judgment, and at mediation of that motion, **the plaintiffs agreed to pay the City of Deltona \$100,000**, even though the legal fees charged to Deltona by the Vose Law Firm were approximately one-third of that amount. Soon after this successful result, several other cases that had been languishing under previous Deltona city attorneys were quickly and advantageously resolved by the Vose Law Firm through negotiation and mediations.

Another recent example of the Vose Law Firm's successful local government representation is litigation involving a proposed RaceTrac service station in the Town of Oakland. Oakland had held firm in its position to prevent direct access from State Road 50 to the site of the proposed RaceTrac, and instead required access via a signalized side street. This was despite RaceTrac having received a conditional permit for the state road access from the FDOT. After being turned down by the town, the owner of the property



to be utilized by RaceTrac, represented by the Lowndes Drosdick law firm, filed a petition for certiorari in the Orange County Circuit Court and litigation ensued. The Vose Law Firm was successful in that litigation and the court ruled that the Town of Oakland had the right to deny direct access from a state road despite a conditional permit from the FDOT.

Proposed Cost

"\$7,500 per month, all-inclusive including litigation."

The Vose Law Firm proposes to provide unlimited, and complete Legal services to Barefoot Bay for the monthly retainer amount of \$7,500 per month (\$90,000 per year). That lump sum fee would include general legal services, attendance at meetings, litigation and local bond counsel work, but does not include Risk Management (insurance defense) or general bond counsel work.

There would be no additional billing for any ancillary legal services, research expenses (such as Westlaw/Lexis fees), travel or miscellaneous expenses, (copying, phone, fax, courier, etc.) and no other costs or expenses, (other than the pre-approved out of pocket expenses mentioned in the next paragraph), that would be billed separately. There would be no other expenses or fees charged, regardless of the time needed or complexity involved in any legal matter. Pre-approved out of pocket costs, (such as court filing fees, and court reporter fees), would be billed at cost, with no mark-up or multiplier.

Our flat fee proposal would give complete budgetary certainty as to the Legal expenses of Barefoot Bay, including litigation, while providing unlimited access to the best local government legal talent available in the state.

Hiring our firm on a flat fee is the equivalent of having a large in-house legal staff at a small fraction of the cost. From our experience, litigation cannot always be avoided, and sometimes litigation is needed to proactively protect the best interests of a government. Those are the times when legal expenses can get out of hand if the government is paying for its legal services by the hour. Our clients believe that it is a wise choice to pay a flat fee that includes litigation fees each month to ensure budgetary certainty and prevent the frightening experience of out of control legal costs.

Many local governments with attorneys who charge an hourly rate can suffer "sticker shock" when unexpected litigation occurs, or a unique and time-consuming legal issue arises, and legal fees get extremely high.

Our fixed fee structure (including litigation and all special projects) protects our local government clients from such an experience. Having a law firm that does not charge additional fees for litigation can also be extremely helpful in negotiating a resolution of a dispute. When one side of a dispute is not fearful of runaway legal fees, (such as a government with a fixed fee attorney contract including litigation), and the other side has such fears, the non-fearful party definitely has a "leg-up" in the negotiations.
