Words can have different definitions

When you hear that the BOT is paying a consultant to analyze employee pay and benefits to address "compression" it has nothing to do with the socks employees wear. With the state minimum wage increasing by 75% in 5 years the bottom 17 pay grade will make the same amount while the next 11 pay grades will each be separated by 2.5%. This will compress the pay of skilled and professional employees in relation to other employees. A skilled employee who used to make double minimum wage (in FY21) will only make 30% more than minimum wage in FY27. Without additional raises, these folks will most likely leave BBRD in the next few years for other employers who are willing to pay competitive wages and it will be hard to hire new employees with similar skills and experience at below-market rates.
