

Results of FY23 Budget Kickoff Townhall Meeting

The BOT voted to use the CPI increase of 4.698% (monthly rate of \$72.07). Resident ideas for new projects included:

- Adding an awning along south side of Bldg. A
- Adding decking outside the east side of Bldg. A (open area with stairs down to the water) to add additional storage (to free up space inside Bldg. A)
- Using any new land purchases to build climate-controlled mini-storage units to rent out
- Delete meeting rooms from the <u>unfunded</u> Pool #4 project
