#### Summertime "Back to Basics" Series:

#### Who provides which governmental service to Barefoot Bay residents?

Recreation services (i.e. amenities in common areas including Food & Beverage, meeting rooms, etc.), the enforcement of the DOR, (BBRD internal) non-piped stormwater drainage, and maintenance of all common areas and buildings are provided by BBRD. Everything else is provided by Brevard County. What typically leads to confusion among new residents is the fact the BBRD is located in "unincorporated" Brevard County and is not a municipality. Although our cozy little "community" looks like a small town, it is really just another part of Brevard County. BBRD, as a special district, does not have the jurisdiction or authority that municipalities have in Florida. Staff and the community manager coordinate our efforts with specific Brevard County departments whenever a synergy of efforts can improve service delivery, but ultimately if you have a complaint about County services you really should call your County Commissioner or Brevard County government.

Likewise, BBRD enforces a "private" (i.e. not related to government) DOR as opposed to the Brevard County Code of Ordinances. Asking staff to start a DOR case against a neighbor for a County Code violation, while easier than dealing with the County, is not a wise use of BBRD resources and staff's time. Lastly, a DOR is typically more strict than government codes (a DOR less strict than governmental landuse codes is really meaningless as the stricter government codes would ultimately be enforced). Some people have a bizarre notion that municipal or county ordinances take priority over a DOR. This is simply not true. If municipal or county ordinances "took priority" over DOR rules, there would be virtually no purpose for DOR communities. Typically the stricter ordinance/regulation is enforced.

#### Shrimp Tacos with Mango Salsa—4 servings (12 tacos)

#### Ingredients

- 1.25 pounds shrimp
- Yellow Corn tortilla
- 1 cup shredded cabbage
- 1 mango, finely diced
- ½ red onion, minced
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- ½ jalapeño, minced
- Juice of 1 lime
- ¼ cup chopped fresh cilantro
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil

#### Direction

- 1. Make the mango salsa. In a medium bowl, stir the mango with the red onion, garlic, jalapeño, lime juice and cilantro to combine. Season with salt and pepper; set aside.
- 2. Make the tacos. In a medium bowl, toss the shrimp with the chile powder, garlic powder and cayenne pepper.
- 3. Sauté the shrimp. In a large skillet, heat the olive oil over medium heat. Add the shrimp and sauté until pink and fully cooked through, 4 to 5 minutes. Season with salt, pepper.
- 4. Toast the tortillas. Heat another large skillet over medium heat. Working in batches, place 2 or 3 tortillas in the pan and heat until lightly browned on each side, 1 minute per side. Repeat until all tortillas are toasted.
- 5. Build the tacos. Divide the cabbage among the toasted tortillas. Pile the shrimp on top and
