Hurricane Preparedness Tips:

Hurricanes and Natural disasters can be a stressful time for everyone. Here are some tips from Brevard EOC to help you be better prepared.

- Know your risk- The first step to understanding risk in our community is to learn about the potential hazards. This website is designed to provide you with an overview on:
- Build a kit—A disaster supply kit is a collection of essential items your household may need in the event of an emergency. Assemble your kit, and review it annually. If you evacuate, take your kit with you.
- Have a plan—Having a plan for what to do in the event of an emergency is the most important step you can take. Think about the situations which can affect our community and how that would affect your household or business. If separated, make sure you have a designated meeting point and that everyone knows where it is.
- Stay Informed - Information is critical before, during and after a disaster or emergency. There are several tools available in Brevard County to stay informed during an emergency situation or disaster.
- Get Involved—Building a culture of preparedness is how we make Brevard a more resilient community. A trained, informed, and engaged public is the best way to empower individuals to lend support.
