### Mini Frozen Key Lime Pies: Makes 12

- 1/3 cup granulated sugar
  - 2.5 cups heavy cream, divided
  - 2 tsp regular or key lime zest, plus more for serving
  - 1/3 cup regular or key lime juice (from 10 key limes)
  - 14 graham crackers
  - Pinch of salt
  - 6 tbsp unsalted butter, melted
  - 1/4 cup sour cream
  - 2 tbsp confectioners' sugar
  - 1/2 tsp pure vanilla extract
1. In medium saucepan, combine granulated sugar and 2 cups cream and bring to a boil, stirring, about 5 min. Reduce heat & simmer 1 min. Remove from heat & add lime zest & juice. Cool 20 min.
  2. Meanwhile, in food processor, pulse graham crackers & a pinch of salt to form fine crumbs. Add butter & pulse to combine. Transfer mixture to 9-in. pie plate or divide mixture among twelve 2.5-oz foil pie tins & press evenly up bottoms & sides. Freeze until firm, about 15 min.
  3. Transfer cooled cream mixture to prepared crust. Freeze until just set, 45 to 90 min. Beat sour cream, confectioners' sugar, vanilla, and remaining 1/2 cup heavy cream to form stiff peaks. Spoon onto pie(s) and freeze until firm, at least 30 min. Sprinkle with additional lime
